PROFILE

Born not long after the cessation of WWII hostilities, I was brought up with a deep respect for those who served from my childhood suburb of Tennyson, and this has driven me to research, write and lecture on the impact of war in the Australian community and, above all, to emulate the service of those I learned to revere in my youth, albeit by giving peacetime service to the community via leadership roles in Scouting, church, professional institutes, and various associations.

In August 2015 my respect for those who served our Nation in times of war was reflected in the unveiling and dedication of a monument by the side of the abandoned WWII RAAF Leyburn airfield on the Darling Downs. This project was instigated and financially supported by myself, and I was honoured when the Leyburn community asked me to chair the organising committee.

I was appointed a Justice of the Peace in 1975 and have received recognition from the Attorney General of Queensland. In the 2014 Australia Day Honours, I received the Order of Australia Medal (OAM) for service to youth, and I have also received several Scouting awards culminating in the Silver Emu, Scouting's second highest adult leadership award.

I am an Associate Fellow of the Risk Management Institute of Australasia (RMIA) and an Honorary Life Member of the Genealogical Society of Queensland, an organisation I founded in 1978.

I have extensive experience in leadership roles, public speaking, and adult leader training.

SPEAKING TOPICS

THE BLACK DAYS OF 1942

This is the flagship of my speeches. It is a moving 40 minute account of just how ill-prepared and vulnerable Australia, especially Queensland, was at the outbreak of the WWII Pacific conflict.

The presentation starts with Group Captain Grant's personal account of a February 1942 briefing to the senior officers of RAAF North East Area Command in Townsville, and includes far reaching and little known details of the position as determined by the Allied Joint Chiefs of Staff.

It is hair raising account and compelling listening in these days of uncertainty when Sir Winston Churchill's term "The Gathering Storm" is all too relevant.

THE SPIRIT OF ANZAC

A moving 20 minute presentation covering the sacrifices and successes of our service men and women and their families who carried the baton in their absence.
