- A story about how you connected with a distant relative.

### ENTRY CRITERIA

- Entrants must be a financial Member of CFHRI
- limited to 1250 words (and include a word count at the end), shorter stories accepted
- include the entrant's name and membership number (not to be made available to the judges)
- submitted electronically in Word <u>NOT</u> PDF format
- typed using Arial 12 font with a space between each paragraph
- Competition entry presumes permission for stories to be published in the Clipper.

Entries are to be emailed to the Competition Co-ordinator, Sue Brownjohn (<u>brownjohn@bigpond.com</u>) who will confirm eligibility before passing them to the judges.

### JUDGING CRITERIA

The judges will assess entries against the following criteria which will enable the judges to provide feedback to entrants if requested. The three-person judging panel will **NOT** include the Co-ordinator.

- Meets the criteria of the competition
- Presentation (appearance and arrangement of the entry)
- Entertaining (written in a manner that will make the reader look forward to reading it)
- Readability (flow building on the story)
- Focus (sticks to the subject or theme)
- Spelling, Grammar and Language
- Family History content and research

A member of the Judging Panel will make the presentation to the two winners at the AGM.
